

**SUWANNEE COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT
MEETING MINUTES**

December 16, 2021

The Suwannee County Conservation District Board of Supervisors held their regularly scheduled meeting, along with Christmas Dinner, Thursday December 16, 2021 at the residence of James and Joan Williams located at 10592 122nd Street Live Oak, FL. Supervisors attending were Andy Jackson, Chairman; Ronnie Lawson, Vice Chairman; James Williams, Secretary/Treasurer; Terry Reagan, Supervisor; and Larry Sessions, Supervisor.

Also attending were Joni Sapp, SCCD Staff Assistant; Garrett McCray, SCCD Administrator; Joel Love, UF/IFAS BMP Education Coordinator; and Tiffany Smith, SCCD Conservation Technician.

Chairman, Andy Jackson, called the meeting to order at 7:21p.m.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. James Williams motioned for those minutes to be approved. This motion was seconded by Ronnie Lawson.

The Financial Reports were reviewed. James Williams motioned to approve those reports. This motion was seconded by Larry Sessions.

Garrett McCray, SCCD Administrator, discussed our current contracts. For BMP Tools, we have approximately \$485,000 contracted with 19 CSA's. RESTORE Energy has \$304,000 contracted with 13 CSA's and RESTORE BMP has \$354,000 contracted with 13 CSA's.

Tiffany Smith, SCCD Conservation Technician, stated that she has been working on NOI's, IV's, and Cost Share. She also mentioned that the Nutrient Efficiency Plan is now live in FSA.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Board discussed possibly having the Conservation Technician position applicant interviews in January, with hopes of having more applicants by then.

NEW BUSINESS:

The ordinary bills from Verizon Wireless and Jim Hinton Oil were presented. Terry Reagan motioned to pay the bills. This motion was seconded by James Williams.

The next District Meeting will be held Thursday January 20, 2022.


OTHER BUSINESS:

Annual competitions were discussed with a decision being made to have Land Judging but not Envirothon. We will also attempt having the Soil Stewardship Banquet this year as well, depending on COVID-19 restrictions.
